The Fly Fishing Museum of the Southern Appalachians Grand Opening was on June 6, 2015. Hopefully, you will make plans to visit soon. So far there is no admission fee – just an opportunity to make a donation. The Museum has officially received a 501c3 tax exempt certificate.

Southern Trout (online) Magazine's Don Kirk, has generously donated \$20,000 worth of advertising to the Museum. To further enhance such advertising you are encouraged to subscribe to this <u>free</u> online magazine, as well tell your friends about the magazine <u>www.southerntrout.com</u> and the Museum.

Overall over 40 exhibits are open, 24 of them are "Stream Blazer" exhibits about anglers of the past. An aquarium and conference rooms are works in progress.

The Museum has a number of opportunities for you to join in the development and planning for expansion. With your participation in one or more of many needed activities, you will enhance the museum's scope and vision. Begin your support by visiting the Museum, then generate attendance by enthusiastically telling others about the awesome displays. You may want to consider becoming an annual giver by participating at one of many levels from a Contributor at \$60 per year all the way to a Sustainer at \$1,200 or more with many levels in between.

From Asheville, take I-40 W. then exit 27, follow US 74 W. take exit 74, follow US 441 North into Cherokee. Museum is on the right at 516 Tsali Blvd.

From Atlanta, take I-85 North, take exit 113, follow GA 305 N. through Gainesville, take US 441 North through Clayton, Georgia and Franklin, North Carolina, take exit 74, follow US 441 North into Chero-

kee. Museum is on the right at 516 Tsali

<u>Upcoming Elections at Myrtle Beach Show –</u> At our Fall Show business meeting there will be an election for CATC President and Secretary Treasurer. The members elected will serve in those positions for the subsequent two years. *THE CLUB NEEDS GREATER PARTICIPATION FROM MEMBERS!!* For example, Hack Hensley is currently doing double duty as both President and show host. Hack is willing to be President again, but he would also be pleased if others would step up and be willing to serve in that position for 2016/17.

At the end of this year I will have been the Secretary/Treasurer for 10 years, and will not be up for re-election to an Officer or Director position. I've enjoyed serving the club, but in the future look forward to spending more time with my family, traveling, and pursuing other interests. I plan on continuing to be a CATC member and attending as many shows as possible.

Hopefully some other members will be willing to be nominated for President and Secretary Treasurer for the two year term beginning in January, 2016.

<u>Member "No Shows" Can Cause Problems for Show Hosts –</u> There have been some situations recently in which members have reserved tables for shows, without prepayment, and then not showed up *without notifying the show host*. There are other clubs that will not allow show preregistration without accompanying payment, but the CATC does not desire to implement that policy unless it becomes necessary.

Whenever a member has prepaid, and then has to cancel for personal reasons, the club in most cases is able to refund their show payment, and strives to do so. I mailed several show refund checks to members in 2014, and we certainly don't mind doing that. Life and family is obviously more important than any hobby, and there are many valid reasons for not being able to attend a show after preregistering. But what we are asking is when this situation occurs that *you notify the show host and make them aware that you will not attend*.

Our show hosts invest much of their time and energy, and we should make it as easy on them as possible. The host needs to know how many tables and which ones are available for other members to use, including new and existing members who want to register and reserve tables the morning of the show. Tables they are holding are not available to be assigned to other members. In summary, we hope all who preregister will be able to attend the show. If not, please notify the show hosts as soon as possible, even if it is after the show starts.

<u>Submit a Newsletter Article, Earn \$50!!</u> – Beginning in 2015, CATC members can earn \$50 by submitting tackle related newsletter articles that are chosen for publication. Each article must be at last two pages long, including any pictures that are incorporated. Articles should be submitted electronically to Steve Barrow at stb647@embarqmail.com. Springmaid Beach Resort to Begin Property-Wide Renovation

MYRTLE BEACH, S.C. (August 19, 2015) –The 30-acre oceanfront Springmaid Beach Resort in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, is set to begin a property-wide renovation project in September. The transformation begins with the demolition of the 1950s-era Marlin's cafeteria and the Cypress guestroom building. In their places, the resort will construct a new waterfront focal point for the resort, including a registration and lobby area, ocean view restaurant with outdoor seating, lobby bar, "grab & go" snack area and outdoor entertainment courtyard.

In addition, the renovation will include a complete makeover of all 452 remaining guest rooms, which are located in the Live Oak and Palmetto towers. All guest rooms will feature an ocean view, private balcony, 40" HD TVs, and a resort-themed design palette. The property will be rebranded as a DoubleTree by Hilton upon completion of the renovation.


