
It's essential that we continue to look for new

Accidental Friend

I began collecting fishing lures about five years ago – by "accident". I had acquired a couple of old wooden lures from a tackle box I had bought from a friend – a Creek Chub mullet and a Heddon Crazy Crawler – and held on to them for a while. I later sold them at an estate auction for my wife's father. I could not believe how much they went for!! I had no idea at the time of their real value. Being from Florida, I had always fished, but to me it was always just "fishing tackle".

After that, when I would go to a flea market, estate sale, or yard sale, I would occasionally buy a fishing lure or two, a rod and reel, or a tackle box – wondering what was worth something and what was not. My wife told me that if I was going to buy these "things" – I needed to learn something about them. So, I searched wherever I could for information, joined CATC, and here I am.

In my search for fishing tackle at the local flea market very early on Sunday mornings, I would, many times, run into an older gentleman. He was also looking for anything of a fishing nature. Over the flea market tables we could discuss each find – the condition, the value, the names, and whether to buy or not to buy. I learned his name was Glen Williams, he was 78 years old, he lived nearby, and that his primary interest was in rods and reels.

We continued our Sunday morning "meetings" for several months and one Sunday morning I asked him to come over and take a look at some things I had collected. He followed me home and we looked over everything, and talked about everything, and that was the beginning of our "accidental

friendship". We spent many other early Sunday mornings together at the flea market after that, and spent hours after I got off work or on Saturdays, comparing our "finds" or "fixing" things. Knee to knee, out in my barn, or in his basement – we were checking things out.

The first time Glen asked me to follow him home – it was a treat I'll never forget. We walked in the door, went to his basement, and I could not believe my eyes. There was a rod and reel everywhere! On the walls, in the corners – everywhere! We then went upstairs, where he had turned an extra bedroom into a storage area – I had never seen so many rods, and so many reels. They were on shelves, in the closet and in boxes – brands I had never seen, or even heard of! I didn't collect rods and reels, but I sure learned a lot about them.

Over the time of our friendship, he became the grandfather I never had, and it wasn't unusual for us to see each other a couple of times a week, and for him to "fix" reels I had taken apart and couldn't get back together!!

Glen died in an accident in the summer of 2011. I lost a true friend – and, a true collector of fishing tackle was lost.





Upon Glen's passing, I was privileged to be able to purchase his collection. I brought them all home and set up an entire 26 x 28 room in my "barn" (which is actually an oversized outbuilding) since my wife would not let me bring them all into the house! I piled them on the floor (everywhere) and each day would go out and move some from one pile to another. Finally, I set up shelves for the 36 +/- tackle boxes and all the other miscellaneous items, and built racks to hold the 400 +/- rods and reels. Although I wasn't a rod and reel collector – I am now. The room is full, many memories are there, and I



look at each item, I can remember his stories of acquisition of some, and can imagine others – and think of our "accidental friendship", and the many lessons he taught me about rods, reels, and life.


I decided to set up my tables at the Myrtle Beach 2011 show in a tribute to Glen. To let other collectors see some of his favorites and some of his unusual fishing "finds", and to recognize him as a collector in that way. Even though he was not a member of CATC - he had several friends among the members. I hope all of you enjoyed!!

I plan to keep his collection to enjoy and to share with others as he shared with me.




